STUDENT COMMENTS - COMMON THREADS

Many students commented that they disliked the self-evaluation at the beginning. Comments mention it being repetitive, irrelevant, too personal. Some mentioned, though, that they enjoyed the opportunity to learn more about themselves.

Many mentioned that they enjoyed the videos. They felt they were able to connect more to the material and could relate to the students. It helped them to feel that they were not alone in their challenges.

A few students liked that they could see an explanation of the various options available in research. They found it useful to see why you may or may not want to try things.

Several found the citing and plagiarism information useful, particularly regarding mulitimedia sources.

Several felt the material was common sense and that anyone in college should already have these fundamentals.

A few found the course difficult to navigate and wished they could have seen an outline of what was expected so they could tell where they were in the course, though some preferred our approach.


Some wished the assignment had the objective pointed out more clearly.


Some students indicated that it took too long to complete.


Students will explain their own attitudes, learning and perceptions about coming to college and consider their behavior in regards to academic life and work.
